**Multi-Disability Championships 2010 Supplement**

(S1-S14 Held under ASA Laws and the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) Rules of swimming)

(S15 Held under ASA Laws and ASA Technical Rules of Racing)

**PROMOTERS CONDITIONS SUPPLEMENT**

The general conditions for the Championships shall apply to the Multi-Disability Swimming events except where varied by any of the following conditions:

1. The Events

50m Freestyle (HDW)	S1 – S15	S1 – S15
100m Freestyle (HDW)	S1 – S15	S1 – S15
50m Backstroke (HDW)	S1 – S15	S1 – S15

The above events will take place at Aqua Vale Sports & Leisure Centre Aylesbury, which has a disability hoist located at the start end of the pool.

Note: Competitors may enter any other events in the championships providing they have gained the appropriate qualifying time, but these will not be classed as multi-disability events.

2. All competitors (IPC Classification S1 – S13 & S15) must have an authorised British Swimming or where applicable IPC Swimming classification, which is held on the British Swimming or IPC Swimming classification database at the time of entry. Competitors in category S14 must hold or have applied for INAS-Fid or national classification.
3. All competitors must hold a current Functional Ability Card (FAC) at the time of entry and a copy must be supplied with entry form.
4. Multi-Disability Swimmers must be a member of a club affiliated to the County Association who is eligible within the meaning of ASA Law and must have been a registered member of the club in whose name he is entered at least 60 days prior to the first day of competition which is 15th February 2010.
5. Qualifying times must have been achieved in the 12 months immediately preceding the closing date (25<sup>th</sup> January 2010) and may be achieved in either a long course or a short course pool. Times from time trials will not be allowed.
6. Functional Ability Cards (FAC's) must be submitted to the Promoter/Lead Referee prior to the start of the session with the athletes' first event. No further submission is required following this. Failure to do so will result in the swimmer being unable to race.
7. All classes of swimmers will swim together (Multi-Disability). The promoter reserves the right to combine events dependent on the number of entries
8. Results will be calculated as recommended by the IPC.
9. Awards will be presented to the top 3 for Each Multi-Disability Event. Presentation will take place at the end of the session.
10. Multi-Disability Swimmers will be judged under the relevant IPC Swimming Rules.
